- Explain the authorities of Governors as cited in the Law of Provinces Not Incorporated into a Region No. 21 of 2008, as amended, and effective laws.
- Collect and unify the authorities of Governors in one publication (the Guide) rather than referring to many and various publications and issues (laws).

GOVERNOR'S ADMINISTRATIVE AUTHORITIES IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE LAW OF PROVINCES NOT INCORPORATED INTO A REGION NO. 21 OF 2008, AS AMENDED, AND EFFECTIVE LAWS

- They comprise authorities related to administrative and organizational aspects as cited in Articles (7/Ninth/Tenth/Eleventh), (27), (31), (32), (33), (34), (39), and (40) of the Law of Provinces not Incorporated into a Region No. 21 of 2008, as amended.
- They comprise authorities related to administrative and organizational aspects as cited in effective laws, and they include:
 - Formation of committees.
 - Leaves related to State employees.
 - Retirement and resignation.
 - Transfer and reassignment.
 - Other administrative authorities.

GOVERNOR'S FINANCIAL AUTHORITIES ACCORDANCE TO THE LAW OF PROVINCES NOT INCORPORATED IN A REGION NO. 21 OF 2008, AS AMENDED, AND EFFECTIVE LAWS

- They comprise authorities related to financial aspects as cited in Law of Provinces and effective laws; they include:
 - Drafting Provincial Public budget and submitting to Provincial Council for approval.
 - Authorities for the implementation of Investment Budget and Accelerated Reconstruction and Development Program (ARDP) projects in accordance with the Law of Implementation of Governmental Contracts No. (2) of 2014 as well as the Law of Federal Public Budget, and its Instructions.

GOVERNOR'S OVERSIGHT AUTHORITIES IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE LAW OF PROVINCES NOT INCORPORATED INTO A REGION NO. 21 OF 2008, AS AMENDED, AND EFFECTIVE LAWS

- They comprise Governor's authorities related to oversight and inspection aspects; they include:
 - Authorities for overseeing the functioning of public facilities in the province and inspecting them, except for courthouses, military units, and universities.
 - Direct authority to oversee and inspect the security services in the province.
 - Managing correspondence between the province and federal ministries and Entities not associated to a Ministry and their directorates in all matters related to the province.

AUTHORITIES RELATED TO LOCAL GOVERNANCE

- They comprise authorities related to local affairs local; they include:
 - Implementing decisions issued by the Provincial Council within its competence.
 - Implementing federal economic, health, scientific, and other policies within administrative boundaries of the province.

GOVERNOR'S AUTHORITIES RELATED TO TECHNICAL AFFAIRS AND PROPERTIES

- They comprise authorities related to technical affairs and those related to state-owned assets so as to ensure province's rights, and they include:
 - Authorities related to sale and lease of public movable and immovable assets.
 - Authorities related to procedures taken to ensure collection of governmental debts and seizure of property to pay debt.

GOVERNOR'S AUTHORITIES RELATED TO CONTRACTS AND BIDS

- They comprise procedural authorities related to concluding of government contracts, contracting methods, and all issues related to bids for investment projects as cited in effective laws and instructions regulating this issue.
